



RULES FOR STALLARD SERIES

About the Stallard Series

- Normal race duration: Road Races 2 – 2.5 hours, Circuit Races 75 – 90 minutes.
- Motorbike marshals will be used for Road Races if at all possible. Chip timing will be used, especially for circuit races, if possible.
- Each round will cover all age categories. Races will normally be grouped: ABC, DE, F+&women. More races may be run if entry numbers, Police approval and resources allow e.g. AB, C, D, E, F & Women, G+. All women will race in the F+ or F group.
- Priority for entry will be given to:
 - Those who contribute to BMCR by organising or helping at BMCR races, or by fulfilling regional/national roles.
 - Those who are in the top five in their age category on current cumulative points in the current year's series.
 - Those who placed in the top five in their age category in the previous year's series.
 - Women
- Organisers need to record the finishing place (in the race) of all finishers if possible, and send those results to results@bmcr.org.uk and the Series Coordinator at stallard@bmcr.org.uk within one day of the event if possible.
- The national results coordinator will maintain an up-to-date table of points in the series on the BMCR website, and post updates on the BMCR Facebook page.

Rules for the competition

- 1 All the rules for standard BMCR Road/Circuit races apply.
- 2 Men will compete in their normal 5-year age categories. Women will compete in three separate women's age categories: 40+, 50+ and 60+.
- 3 Points will be awarded for each race to the top 10 finishers in each age category as follows:

1 st	24
2 nd	22
3 rd	20
4 th	18
5 th	17
6 th	16
7 th	15
8 th	14
9 th	13
10 th	12

4 A rider's best 4 results (when there are 7 or 8 rounds), or best 5 results (when there are 9 or 10 rounds) will be used to determine overall points and overall positions within each age category. The minimum number of rounds to be ridden to count for overall positions is 3.

5 In the event of a tie on overall points, the riders' relative rankings before the latest event will decide their ranking for the series.

6 As in other BMCR events, any challenges over race results must be made to the race organiser on the day, or if full results are not given on the day, within 24 hours of results being published. The organiser's decision is final.

7 Any challenges regarding overall points and places must be made as soon as possible, to the Series Coordinator.

8 If disputes on overall points and places cannot be resolved by the Series Coordinator, the rider should write with full details to the National Race Coordinator, whose decision will be final without further appeal.

9 A Stallard Champion's jersey will be awarded to the first rider in each age category, subject to at least 3 riders scoring points in that category across 3 rounds in the series.

These rules apply from 2026 onwards
